

# New Testament Bible Survey 202 Diploma Level



**Classroom Hours:** 24 (minimum)

## **Description/Overview:**

This course focuses on the twenty-seven books of the New Testament. Building upon Bible Survey/Old Testament, it is an overview emphasizing the main facts concerning each book; authorship, date of composition, purpose, and content.

## Objectives

At the end of this course of study students will be able to:

- 1.) Divide the Gospels into their two categories: Synoptic and Autoptic.
- 2.) Provide the theme, author, date, and direction of each gospel.
- 3.) Describe Jesus as King.
- 4.) Illustrate Jesus' acts as a servant.
- 5.) Explain how Jesus was the perfect divine man and son of God.
- 6.) Point out that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God.
- 7.) Assess the book of Acts as the accurate record of the birth of the church as well as its growth for the first thirty years.
- 8.) Define the gospel as the power of God unto salvation to everyone that believeth, to the Jew first and also to the Greek.
- 9.) Defend Paul's apostleship using evidence found in the book of II Corinthians.
- 10.) Establish Christ as the head of His body, according to Scripture found in Colossians.
- 11.) List the qualities and duties of a Christian minister.
- 12.) Establish the superiority of the new covenant as compared to the old.

## Topics/Concepts:

- The idea that the gospels are not given as books of salvation but rather as books to reveal the cost of salvation. The plan of salvation could only be given after salvation was purchased at Calvary.
- The correction of disorders in the church at Corinth. (Division, immorality, disputes among saints, disorders during the Lord's supper, disorders during worship.)
- The answer to questions concerning marriage, eating meat offered to idols, and the gifts of the Spirit.
- The doctrine of liberty and all it entails.
- The mystery and incarnation of Jesus Christ.
- The order, doctrine, and proper conduct of the church.
- The difference and relationship between Jesus and the angels.
- The five aspects of salvation: source, result, consummation, joy, and mystery.
