Description/Overview:

- 4.) Compare and contrast each religion with the truth of Christianity.
- 5.) State the chosen sacred text of each World Religion.
- 6.) Explain the basic beliefs of each religion.
- 7.) Expound upon the types of followers each religion attracts.
- 8.) Name the founder of each religion.
- 9.) Provide examples of people converted from pagan religion to Christianity.

- The background and upbringing of the founders of major world religions
- The eightfold path of Buddhism
- The development of the Christian church
