Pentecostal History 321 Associate Degree Level



Classroom Hours: 24 (minimum)

Description/Overview:

This study of Pentecostal history covers both the scriptural and historical record of Pentecost. It is a comprehensive course in the history of the oneness apostolic movement.

Objectives:

At the end of this course students will be able to:

- 1.) Locate Scriptures in both the Old and New Testament confirming that the Pentecostal experience is a Scriptural one.
- 2.) Expound upon some Pentecostal revivals experienced throughout history.
- 3.) Explain the importance of Topeka, Kansas, detailing what took place there.
- 4.) Identify the key players in the Azusa Street revival.
- 5.) Label important places the Pentecostal Revival took place in North America.
- 6.) Clarify the necessary components of salvation.
- 7.) State why the Pentecostal Organization became necessary, according to Fred Foster.
- 8.) Restate the founding fathers of the Pentecostal movement.
- 9.) Summarize the impact of Pentecost around the world.

Topics/Concepts:

- The rapid spread of the Pentecostal movement from the Jews on the day of Pentecost, to the Gentiles in Caesarea, to the Ephesians.
- The nineteenth century revivals which prepared the way for apostolic revival.
- The importance and results of the Azusa Street revival.
- The finished work of Calvary as it was explained in early Pentecostal Revivals.
- The early holiness organizations of the movement.
- All the key players of the Pentecostal revivals as well as a concentrated biography about them.
- Signs following: what they are and how they manifest.
