The Habit of Holiness

Those people would be better off thrown into the deepest part of the ocean with a heavy stone tied around their necks
- 3. Women are instructed to <u>appear</u> a certain way so that men are not tempted, while men are instructed to <u>act</u> a certain way so that women are not tempted.
- 4. The Bible mentions several areas of holiness for mature Christians. Name 3 of these and give a brief description of each: (answers will vary)
 - i. <u>Attitude:</u> The fruit of the Spirit (kindness, love, patience, self-control, etc.) must manifest itself in our attitudes.
 - ii. <u>Thought:</u> We must think on true, pure, and noble things, while casting out thoughts that stem from evil lusts and attitudes.
 - iii. <u>Sight:</u> We must guard our eyes as the gate of the soul and the primary source of input for the mind.
 - iv. <u>Speech:</u> We should avoid gossiping, backbiting, slander, causing division, swearing by an oath, complaining, taking the Lord's name in vain, criticizing, cursing, lying, idle words and suggestive or filthy speech.
 - v. <u>Body:</u> Since the body is the temple of the Holy Ghost, we avoid anything that would harm or defile the body, including anything that would cause intoxication or addiction
 - vi. <u>Sex:</u> The Bible condemns all sexual relationships and activity outside of marriage between one man and one woman and opposes lustful thoughts and actions.
 - vii. <u>Fellowship:</u> We should have no fellowship with those who call themselves Christians but continually indulge in sinful activities. We are not to become partnered with unbelievers in relationships such as marriage.
 - viii. <u>Life:</u> In view of the sanctity of human life, Christians must not participate in violence or taking of human life. This includes

abortion, euthanasia, murder, and suicide.

- ix. <u>Honesty:</u> Christians must reject all forms of dishonesty. This would include lying, stealing, defrauding, refusal to pay debts, extortion, bribery, and all types of cheating.
- x. <u>Amusement:</u> Because of the sinfulness of the world today and because of the biblical warnings against loving the world, we must carefully and maturely regulate our music, sports, activities, and amusements.
- xi. <u>Hair:</u> The Bible teaches that men should have short hair and that women should have long uncut hair.
- xii. <u>Appearance:</u> Since modern fashion has strayed so far from Biblical principles, we can no longer rely on society's definition of "modesty" to govern our appearance.
