

Pentecostal Doctrine



Classroom Hours: 30 (minimum)

Description/Overview:

Pentecostal Doctrine builds upon the foundation of the infallible Word of God. From this bedrock rises the framework of the doctrinal principles which began in Christ and were passed directly to His apostles. The term “doctrine” means “teaching,” and we must teach as the apostles taught. This course is a systematic outline of essential apostolic teachings, which gives students the knowledge necessary to live effective apostolic lives.

Objectives:

At the end of this course of study students will be able to:

- 1.) Confirm that the apostle's doctrine was a direct extension of Christ's teaching, and defend the doctrine as the foundation of the New Testament church.
- 2.) Prove the Bible's superiority to all other books.
- 3.) Understand the apostle's concept of God was without controversy, as they had walked with Him in flesh.
- 4.) Summarize the effects of sin on life and the ability of the gospel to deliver from it.
- 5.) Explain though the wages of sin is death, humanity can find forgiveness through repentance.
- 6.) Illustrate water baptism as a test of obedience, and a circumcision of the heart that takes away our spiritual uncleanness.
- 7.) Compare water baptism (in which we are baptized into Christ), with Spirit baptism (in which Christ is baptized into us).
- 8.) Describe the miracle of God's grace and power as one of the tools used by the Spirit to promote the great work of God.
- 9.) Defend the idea that since our God is holy, and Heaven is a holy place, it is reasonable to expect that God's people who plan to go to Heaven must be holy.
- 10.) Identify divine healing as one of the benefits purchased by Christ's suffering and death.
- 11.) Assess the second coming of Christ as the hope and comfort of the church.
- 12.) Point out how all nature testifies of the resurrection of the dead as the greatest miracle of the ages.
- 13.) Comprehend that everyone must answer to God for his thoughts, words, and deeds.
