Description/Overview:

The books of Romans outlines salvation so clearly that the way to is commonly called "the Roman road." In this course, students will travel the length and breadth of this road making stops to emphasize the need, the way, and the fruit of salvation. Along the way, they will delve into Paul's purpose for writing, examine the condition of Israel at the time, and glean practical tips for Christian living.

Objectives:

At the end of this course students will be able to:

- 1.) State the author of the book of Romans.
- 2.) Divide the book into four basic sections.
- 3.) Identify the key thought of the book as justification by faith.
- 4.) Establish the book of Romans as a doctrinal treatise on the gospel of Jesus Christ.
- 5.) Emphasize man's need for salvation.
- 6.) Explain the responsibility the Jews had considering their greater light and privilege.
- 7.) Prove that moral works of righteousness cannot merit self-justification.
- 8.) Expound upon the necessity of abstaining from sin even though works do not earn salvation.
- 9.) Outline God's prescription for saving faith.
- 10.) Provide examples of the fruit of salvation made manifest in a believer's life.

Topics | Concepts:

- The book of Romans as a profound and systematic study of the whole plan of salvation from sin and sin's penalty of death.
- Salvation why we need it, how we get it, and what results from it.
- Death through repentance
- Burial through baptism
- Resurrection through the power of the Holy Spirit
- The carnal nature of humanity before redemption.
- Confidence in God not only according to salvation, but in the fact that He will work everything out concerning our welfare.
- Israel's past, present, and future
- The purpose and importance of the preaching the Word
