Periods of Church History

Apostolic Doctrine Restored

- 1) A.D. 1901 – 2006 – Period of Apostolic Doctrine Restored
 - Some outstanding events during this period were –
 - 1) Charles F. Parham began his ministry
 - a. Through long hours of devoted prayer and intense study, the scriptures opened to him.
 - b. He taught a return to the fundamental teachings of the scriptures and the cleansing of men's hearts
 - c. He taught that speaking with tongues was the evidence of the Holy Ghost
 - d. The Holy Ghost fell in Topeka on New Years 1901
 - 2) Evan Roberts and the Wales Revival
 - a. It began to reached a zenith in November, 1904
 - b. Roberts had a "Burning Passion for Jesus.
 - c. Taught speaking with tongues
 - d. March 1905, the total number of conversions had reached 83,936
 - e. Another six months and the number easily escalated to 100,000
 - i. Bars closed
 - ii. Crime diminished
 - iii. Courts had no cases
 - 3) William J. Seymour and the Azusa Street Revival
 - a. He preached Tongues as the evidence of the Holy Ghost
 - b. Locked out of the church
 - c. House meetings were held at Bonnie Brae Street
 - d. Holy Ghost began to fall April 1906.
 - e. The Azusa Street Mission was established
 - f. The movement was called The Apostolic Faith Movement
- 4) International Camp Meeting at Arroyo Seco
 - a. This was held in 1913.
 - b. R. E. McAlister was asked to speak for the Baptismal service.
 - c. He preached that The Apostles baptized ONLY in the name of Jesus Christ
 - d. The Assemblies of God. Was organized in 1914
 - e. The men who were the movers:
 - i. Howard Goss
 - ii. E. N. Bell
 - iii. Daniel Opperman
 - f. E. N. Bell was elected as the 1st General Superintendent
- 5) Baptism in the name of Jesus Christ was restored and called The New Issue

- a. The conference debate of the Assemblies of God rejected the Baptism in the name of Jesus Christ in 1916
 - b. E. N. Bell was baptized in the name of Jesus Christ, but later returned to the Trinitarian doctrine
 - c. Frank Ewart baptized Glen A. Cook and Glen A. Cook baptized Ewart
- 6) G. T. Haywood was known as a gifted Orator and walking Bible.
 - a. He was pastor of Christ temple in Indianapolis, Indiana
 - b. G. T Haywood was baptized in Jesus' name by Glen A. Cook
- 8) When the Oneness Ministers were rejected from the Assemblies of God, the Oneness brethren established the General Assembly of Apostolic Assemblies
- 9) William H. Durham was pastor of the North Avenue Mission in Chicago, Illinois
 - a. He preached the Finished Work of Calvary
- 11) After a number of mergers, the Pentecostal Churches Incorporated and the Pentecostal Assemblies of Jesus Christ merged to form the United Pentecostal Church in 1945
- 13) Howard Goss was elected the first General Superintendent of the United Pentecostal Church.
 - a. He chose not to serve in 1951.
- 14) Arthur T. Morgan. Was elected the 2nd General Superintendent in 1951
 - a. Arthur T. Morgan collapsed and died during the General Conference convening in Tulsa, Oklahoma, 1967
- 15) Oliver Fauss was appointed to fulfill Brother Morgan's unexpired term
- 16) Stanley W. Chambers was elected as the 4th General Superintendent
 - a. He chose to retire in 1977
- 17) Nathaniel A. Urshan was elected as the 5th General Superintendent
 - a. Brother Urshan retired in 2002
- 18) Kenneth F. Haney was elected the 6th General Superintendent
